



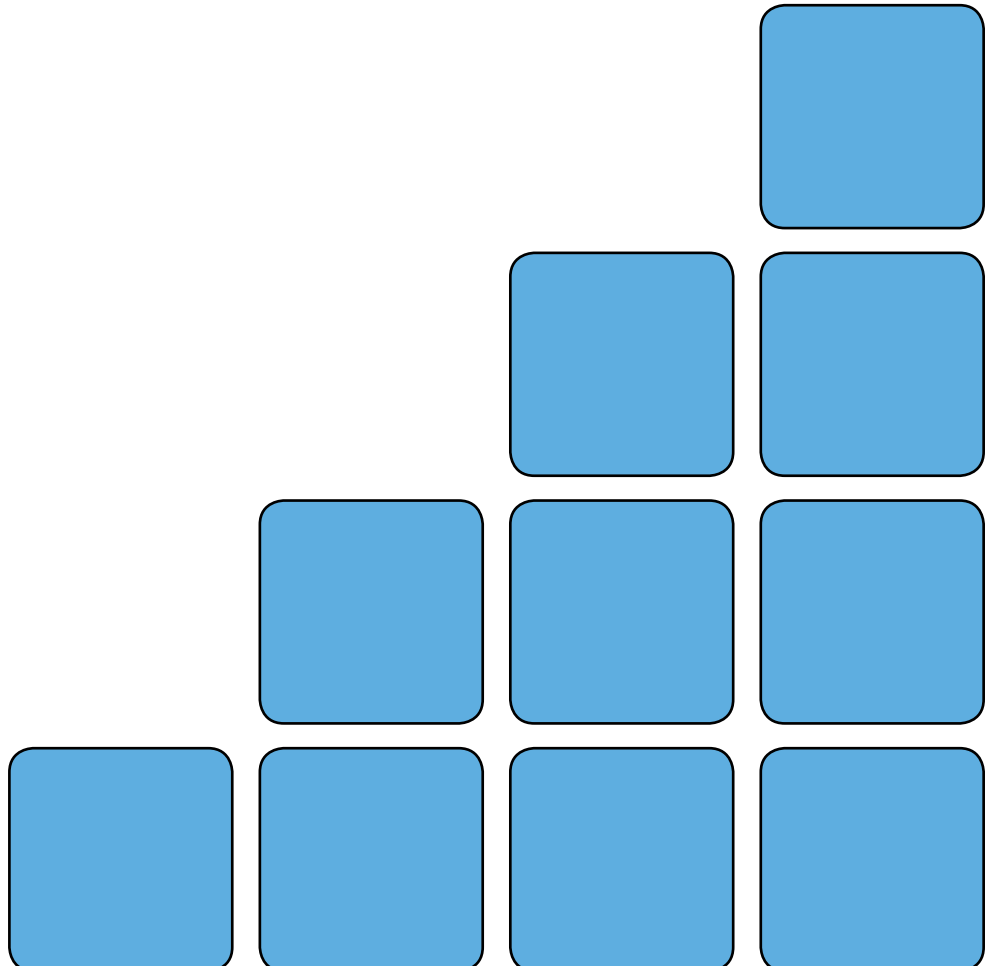

Provide specialist skin camouflage services

This unit is about providing specialist skin camouflage services to address a wide range of conditions, to restore the skin's colouring to match the unaffected skin tone. It also covers the use of a variety of specialist camouflage products, together with client instruction in the application, maintenance and removal of their own skin camouflage.

To carry out this unit you will need to maintain effective health, safety and hygiene throughout your work. You will also need to maintain your personal appearance and demonstrate effective communication and consultation skills.

The main outcomes of this unit are:

1. Maintain safe and effective methods of working when providing specialist skin camouflage
2. Consult, plan and prepare for specialist skin camouflage
3. Carry out specialist skin camouflage
4. Instruct and advise the client on skin camouflage techniques
5. Evaluate the success of instruction

Evidence requirements

1. *Environment*
Evidence for this unit may be gathered within the workplace or realistic working environment (RWE).
2. *Simulation*
Simulation is allowed in this unit.
3. *Observation outcomes*
Competent performance of Observation outcomes must be demonstrated on **at least four occasions, involving four different clients**, with the permission of the client.

Assessor observations, witness testimonies and products of work are likely to be the

most appropriate sources of performance evidence.

Professional discussion may be used as supplementary evidence for those criteria that do not naturally occur.

Assessed observations should not be carried out on the same day for the same learning outcome. There should be sufficient time between assessments for reflection and personal development.

You need to meet the same standard on a regular and consistent basis. Separating the assessments by a period of at least two weeks is recommended as competence must be demonstrated on a consistent and regular basis.

4. *Range*
All ranges must be practically demonstrated or other forms of evidence produced to show they have been covered.
5. *Knowledge outcomes*
There must be evidence that you possess all the knowledge and understanding listed in the Knowledge section of this unit. In most cases this can be done by professional discussion and/or oral questioning. Other methods, such as projects, assignments and/or reflective accounts may also be used.
6. *Tutor/Assessor guidance*
Your tutor **must** refer to the '**Habia Assessment Strategy**' when delivering this unit to ensure that you cover all the requirements for this unit. This can be found on www.vtct.org.uk under the relevant qualification page.

You will be guided by your tutor/assessor on how to achieve learning outcomes and cover ranges in this unit. All outcomes and ranges must be achieved.
7. *External paper*
There is no external paper requirement for this unit.

Achieving observations and range

Achieving observation outcomes

Your assessor will observe your performance of practical tasks. The minimum number of competent observations required is indicated in the Evidence requirements section of this unit.

Criteria may not always naturally occur during a practical observation. In such instances you will be asked questions to demonstrate your competence in this area. Your assessor will document the criteria that have been achieved through professional discussion and/or oral questioning. This evidence will be recorded by your assessor in written form or by other appropriate means.

Your assessor will sign off a learning outcome when all criteria have been competently achieved.

Achieving range

The range section indicates what must be covered. Ranges should be practically demonstrated as part of an observation. Where this is not possible other forms of evidence may be produced. All ranges must be covered.

Your assessor will document the portfolio reference once a range has been competently achieved.

You must be able to:

- a. Maintain your responsibilities for health and safety throughout the service
- b. Prepare your client and yourself to meet legal and organisational requirements
- c. Respect your client's modesty, privacy and any sensitivities to their personal appearance
- d. Position your client to meet the needs of the service without causing them discomfort
- e. Ensure your own posture and working methods minimise fatigue and the risk of injury to yourself and others
- f. Ensure environmental conditions are suitable for the client and the service
- g. Keep your work area clean and tidy throughout the service
- h. Use working methods that minimise the risk of cross-infection
- i. Ensure the use of clean equipment and materials
- j. Promote environmental and sustainable working practices
- k. Follow workplace and suppliers' or manufacturers' instructions for the safe use of equipment, materials and products
- l. Dispose of waste materials to meet legal requirements
- m. Complete the service within a commercially viable time

Learning outcome 2

Be able to consult, plan and prepare for specialist skin camouflage

You must be able to:

- a. Use consultation techniques to determine the client's service plan
- b. Ensure that informed and signed parent or guardian consent is obtained for minors prior to any service
- c. Ensure that a parent or guardian is present throughout the service for minors under the age of 16
- d. Recognise any contra-indications and take the necessary action
- e. Identify and agree the skin camouflage needs and the area to be camouflaged with the client
- f. Obtain signed, informed consent from the client prior to carrying out the service
- g. Ensure the client understands the limitations of skin camouflage

Learning outcome 3

Be able to carry out specialist skin camouflage

You must be able to:

- a. Apply compatible skin care products and a complementary colour before the skin camouflage application
- b. Use application tools, techniques and camouflage products which are best suited to the client and their skin camouflage needs
- c. Establish an acceptable colour match on the area to be camouflaged to restore the skin colouration to the surrounding skin tone
- d. Ensure camouflage products are applied to achieve the required density, colour and effect
- e. Apply compatible cosmetic and skin care products after the skin camouflage application
- f. Give your client advice and recommendations on the service provided
- g. Ensure the client's records are completed and signed by you and the client

Learning outcome 4

Be able to instruct and advise the client on skin camouflage techniques

You must be able to:

- a. Discuss and recommend camouflage products and application tools and techniques to meet the client's skin camouflage needs
 - i. Remind the client that they should discontinue the use of camouflage product until medical opinion is sought
- b. Demonstrate application on the area to be camouflaged and check the client's understanding
- c. Use instructional techniques which are delivered at a pace suitable for the client
- d. Guide the client through self-application and removal of the skin camouflage product
- e. Guide the client on how to select and apply compatible cosmetic and skin care products, for use under or over their camouflage
- f. Allow the client time to practise skin camouflage techniques on themselves
- g. Provide the client with opportunities to give feedback, ask questions and seek clarification
- h. Remind the client on the need to seek medical opinion if any lesions, moles, or conditions change

- b. Ask your client questions on the delivery of the instruction process and record their feedback
- c. Use client feedback to make improvements to your own skin camouflage instructional techniques and delivery

Achieving knowledge outcomes

When a criterion has been orally questioned and achieved, your assessor will record this evidence in written form or by other appropriate means. There is no need for you to produce additional evidence as this criterion has already been achieved.

Some knowledge and understanding outcomes may require you to show that you know and understand how to do something. If you have practical evidence from your own work that meets knowledge criteria, then there is no requirement for you to be questioned again on the same topic.
